

## Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 40" wide.

## Pattern Notes

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 40" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

### From Fabric A, cut:

three 9" X WOF strips. Subcut: ten 9" squares

### From each of Fabrics B, C and D, cut:

three 9" x WOF strips. Subcut: twelve 9" squares

#### From Fabric E, cut:

six 9" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four 9" squares

#### From Fabric F, cut:

six 9" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-two 9" squares

## From the binding fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

# Assemble the Half Square Triangles

**Step 1:** Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of each Fabric A-D square- half marked one direction for each print and half marked the opposite direction. This is important for the final blocks to have the print oriented correctly.

**Step 2:** Pair each Fabric A and B square with a Fabric F square, right sides together. Sew along both sides of the marked line, 1/4" away from the line. Cut along the marked line, creating two half-square triangle units (HSTs). Press toward Fabric F. Trim to 8-1/2" square, if necessary. Make a total of twenty A/F HSTs and twenty-four B/F HSTs. Due to the directional nature of some fabrics, a few will be unused.





Make twenty A/F HSTs

**Step 3:** Repeat Step 2, pairing each Fabric C and D square with a Fabric E square, right sides together. Sew along both sides of the marked line, 1/4" away from the line. Cut along the marked line, creating two half-square triangle units (HSTs). Press toward Fabric E. Trim to 8-1/2" square, if necessary. Make a total of twenty-four C/E HSTs and twenty-four D/E HSTs.

## Assemble the A and B Blocks


**Step 4:** Pair HST units together in matching sets. Pay special attention to the orientation of the prints and position the Fabric E and F pieces toward the outer edge of the block. Sew together along one side and press the seam open. Repeat with all eighty HST units to create forty blocks. Due to the directional fabrics, some HST blocks will be unused.

Make six C/E HSTs that point up





**Step 5:** Gather all Fabric E units. Sew one C/E and one D/E unit together along the longest side, noting the orientation and placement of the prints. Repeat to create ten A Blocks.





**Step 6:** Gather all Fabric F units. Sew one A/F and one B/F unit together along the longest side, noting the orientation and placement of the prints. Repeat to create ten B Blocks.



## Assemble the Quilt



**Step 7:** Arrange the A and B Blocks into five rows of four blocks each, alternating blocks A and B and noting the orientation of the blocks in the Quilt Assembly Diagram. Sew the blocks into rows, pressing toward the F blocks. Sew the rows together, nesting seams.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

## Garden Colorstory Cutting Instructions

## From each of Fabrics A, C and D, cut:

three 9" X WOF strips. Subcut: twelve 9" squares

## From Fabric B, cut:

three 9" x WOF strips. Subcut: ten 9" squares

### From Fabric E, cut:

six 9" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-four 9" squares

### From Fabric F, cut:

six 9" x WOF strips. Subcut: twenty-two 9" squares

### From the binding fabric, cut:

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips







