# Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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# Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

# **Cutting Instructions**

# From Fabric A, fussy cut:

- one 20-1/2" square for the center block
- four 4-1/2" squares from a darker portion of the fabric, for use in the center of the corner blocks
- eight 4-1/2" squares from a lighter portion of the fabric, for use in the corners of the corner blocks

### From Fabric B, cut:

- three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
  - two 2-1/2" x 20-1/2" top and bottom inner borders
  - two 2-1/2" x 24-1/2" side inner borders

#### From Fabric C, cut:

- three 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim to yield:
  - four 4-1/2" x 24-1/2" strips

#### From Fabric D, cut:

eight 4-1/2" x <u>length of fabric</u> strips. Trim each strip to 4-1/2" x 24-1/2".

#### From Fabric E, cut:

- seven 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew three strips together, end-to-end, then trim to yield:
  - four 4-1/2" x 24-1/2" strips
- From the remaining strips, subcut:
  - sixteen 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the corner blocks

# From Fabric F, cut:

- six 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew three strips together, end-to-end, then trim to yield:
  - four 4-1/2" x 24-1/2" strips
- From the remaining strips, subcut:
  - twenty-four 4-1/2" squares for the corner blocks

#### From Fabric G, cut:

- four 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
  - thirty-two 4-1/2" squares for the corner blocks

## From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

# Assemble the Quilt Center

**Step 1**: Sew the 20-1/2" Fabric B strips to the top and bottom edges of the 20-1/2" Fabric A center square. Press toward the strips. Sew the 24-1/2" Fabric B strips to the left and right edges of the center square. Press toward the strips.



# Assemble the Corner Blocks

### Step 2: Gather:

one 4-1/2" dark Fabric A square two 4-1/2" light Fabric A squares eight 4-1/2" Fabric G squares six 4-1/2" Fabric F squares four 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric E rectangles

Arrange, following the diagrams below. Note that each of the four corner blocks is unique in the placement of the light Fabric A squares.



Upper Left



Upper Right



Lower Left



Lower Right

**Step 3**: Note: the instructions below show the top left block as an example. Use the same process for the remaining three corner blocks, noting the fabric placement shown in the diagrams in Step 2.

Sew the 4-1/2" squares together to form four 4-patch units, as shown. Press toward the darker fabrics.





Press towards arrows






**Step 4:** Referring to the block diagram in Step 2, sew a 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric E rectangle between the top two 4-patch units in the block. Press toward the rectangle. Repeat with the bottom two 4-patch units in the block.

**Step 5**: Sew a Fabric E rectangle to the left and right edges of the dark Fabric A square. Press toward the rectangles.

**Step 6:** Sew the complete step 4 units to the top and bottom of the step 5 unit to form the upper left corner block. Press the seams to one side. The resulting block should measure 20-1/2" square. Repeat to make the remaining three corner blocks, paying careful attention to fabric placement.

# Assemble the Side Units

**Step 7:** Sew the 4-1/2" x 24-1/2" strips together along the longest edge, in the following order: Fabric C - Fabric D - Fabric E - Fabric D - Fabric F. Press the seams to one side. Repeat to make four side units, each measuring 20-1/2" x 24-1/2".



### Assemble the Quilt

**Step 8:** Arrange the center unit, four corner blocks and four side units to form three rows of three. Refer to the Quilt Assembly Diagram for proper fabric placement and block orientation. Sew the units together to form rows, pressing the seams toward the side units. Sew the rows together to form the quilt top, pressing the seams to one side.

Your quilt top is now complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
