Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

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- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From Fabric A, cut:

four 5-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

twenty-eight 5-1/4" squares for the Large Flying Geese.

seven 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

fifty-six 4-1/2" squares for the Small Star blocks.

five 3-1/4" x WOF strips. Subcut:

fifty-six 3-1/4" squares for the Small Flying Geese.

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:

one-hundred and twelve 2-1/2" squares for the Large Star blocks.

eight 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut: two-hundred and twenty-four 1-1/2" squares for the Small Star units.

From each of Fabrics B-H, cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: four 4-1/2" squares of each fabric for the Large Star blocks. Trim the remainder of the strips to 2-7/8", then subcut: two 2-7/8" squares of each fabric for the Large Flying Geese. one 2-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut:

fourteen 2-7/8" squares of each fabric for the Large Flying Geese.

From each of Fabric I-O, cut:

one 2-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut: eight 2-1/2" squares of each fabric for the Small Star units. Trim the remainder of the strips to 1-7/8", then subcut: ten 1-7/8" squares of each fabric for the Small Flying Geese. one 1-7/8" x WOF strip. Subcut: twenty-two 1-7/8" squares of each fabric for the Small Flying Geese.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

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Step 1: Pin two 2-7/8" Fabric B squares in opposing corners of a 5-1/4" Fabric A square, RST. The squares will overlap slightly in the center of the large square. Using a ruler, draw a diagonal line through the squares.

Step 2: Sew scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set the seam by pressing it flat. Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 3: Press the fabric toward smaller triangles. Repeat with the second unit.

Step 4: Place one 2-7/8" Fabric B square at the corner of a sewn block unit. Draw a diagonal line in pencil. Sew a scant 1/4" seam on each side of the diagonal line. Set seam (press). Cut along the diagonal line, creating two identical units.

Step 5: Press the seam toward the smaller triangle. Trim off small dog ears left by the seam allowance. Trim to 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" if necessary.

Step 6: Repeat with all remaining 5-1/4" Fabric A squares and 2-7/8" Fabric B-H squares to make Large Flying Geese in Fabrics B-H. You will have sixteen Large Flying Geese of each fabric.

Step 7: Repeat Steps 1-6 using a 3-1/4" Fabric A square paired with the 1-7/8" squares of Fabrics I-O to make Small Flying Geese. Trim to 1-1/2" x 2-1/2" if necessary. You will have sixteen Small Flying Geese of each fabric.

Assemble the Large Star Blocks

Step 8: Gather: four 2-1/2" Fabric A squares one 4-1/2" Fabric B square four Fabric B Large Flying Geese

Arrange the squares and flying geese in three rows of three as shown.

Step 9: Sew the rows together, then press towards the squares. Nest the seams and sew the rows together.

Step 10: Repeat to make four Large Star Blocks in Fabrics B-H. You will have four in each of Fabrics B-H.















Step 11: Gather: four 1-1/2" Fabric A squares one 2-1/2" Fabric I square four Fabric I Small Flying Geese

Arrange the squares and flying geese in three rows of three as shown.

Step 12: Sew the rows together, then press towards the squares. Nest the seams and sew the rows together.

Step 13: Repeat to make eight Small Star units in each of Fabrics I-O.



Assemble the Small Star Blocks



Step 14: Gather: two 4-1/2" Fabric A squares one Fabric I Small Star unit one Fabric J Small Star unit

Arrange the squares and Small Star units in two rows of two as shown.

Step 15: Sew the rows together, then press towards the squares. Nest the seams and sew the rows together.

Step 16: Repeat to make a total of twenty-eight Small Star Blocks in the combinations shown on the Quilt Assembly Diagram (page 6).



Assemble the Quilt



Step 17: Arrange the blocks into eight rows of seven blocks. Notice how the Large Star and Small Star blocks alternate across the quilt in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 18: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the seams to the left in the oddnumbered rows and to the right in the even-numbered rows.

Step 19: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!

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
