## Fabric and Supplies Needed

*Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.*

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## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## Cutting Instructions

### **From Fabric A, cut:**

two 12-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:  
one 12-1/2" x 52-1/2" rectangle for Row 4

### **From Fabric B, cut:**

two 8-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:  
eight 8-1/2" squares

### **From Fabric C, cut:**

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:  
two 2-1/2" x 52-1/2" strips

### **From Fabric D, cut:**

three 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:  
two 4-1/2" x 52-1/2" strips for Rows 3 and 5

### **From Fabric E, cut:**

one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:  
two 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the large flying geese  
four 4-1/2" squares for the large flying geese  
sixteen 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:  
six 2-1/2" x 52-1/2" sashing strips  
two 2-1/2" x 68-1/2" side inner borders  
eighty 2-1/2" squares for the small flying geese

### **From each of Fabrics F and G, cut:**

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:  
twenty 2-1/2" x 4-1/2" rectangles for the small flying geese

### **From each of Fabrics H-K, cut:**

three 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:  
six 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" rectangles for the large flying geese  
twelve 4-1/2" squares for the large flying geese



**From Fabric L, cut:**

seven 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew together, end-to-end, then trim:

two 4-1/2" x 64-1/2" top/bottom outer borders

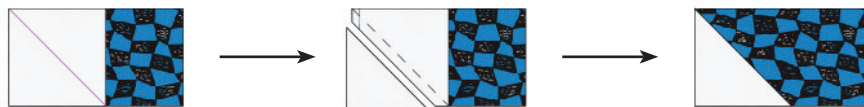
two 4-1/2" x 68-1/2" side outer borders

**From the Binding Fabric, cut:**

eight 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## Assemble the Flying Geese Units

**Step 1:** Place a 2-1/2" Fabric E square RST at one end of a Fabric F rectangle. Mark a diagonal line on the wrong side of the square, as shown. Sew on the marked line and trim away the excess fabric, leaving a 1/4" seam allowance. Press toward the triangle.



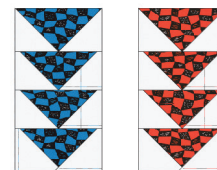
**Step 2:** Repeat Step 1 at the remaining end of the rectangle. The resulting flying geese block should measure 2-1/2" x 4-1/2".



**Step 3:** Repeat with all remaining Fabric F and Fabric G rectangles, making twenty from each fabric. These will be referred to as the Small Flying Geese.



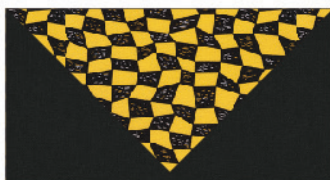
**Step 4:** Sew four Fabric F small flying geese together to form a column. Press. Repeat to make five units like this. Repeat to make five units from Fabric G small flying geese.



**Step 5:** Repeat Steps 1 and 2, this time with a 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" Fabric E rectangle and 4-1/2" Fabric H squares to make two 4-1/2" x 8-1/2" E/H Flying Geese. These will be referred to as the Large Flying Geese. Make Large Flying Geese in the following quantities:



six Fabric H/I  
Large Flying Geese

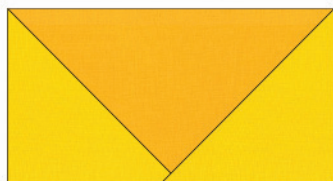


six Fabric I/J  
Large Flying Geese

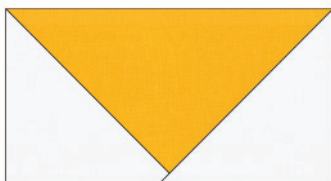


six Fabric J/K  
Large Flying Geese





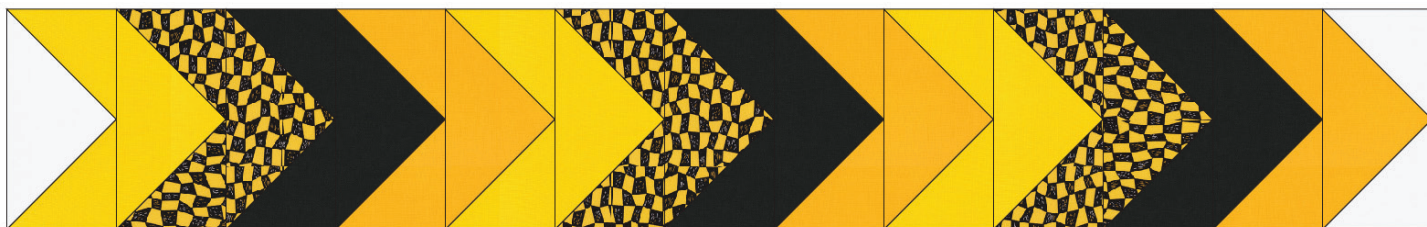
six Fabric K/H  
Large Flying Geese



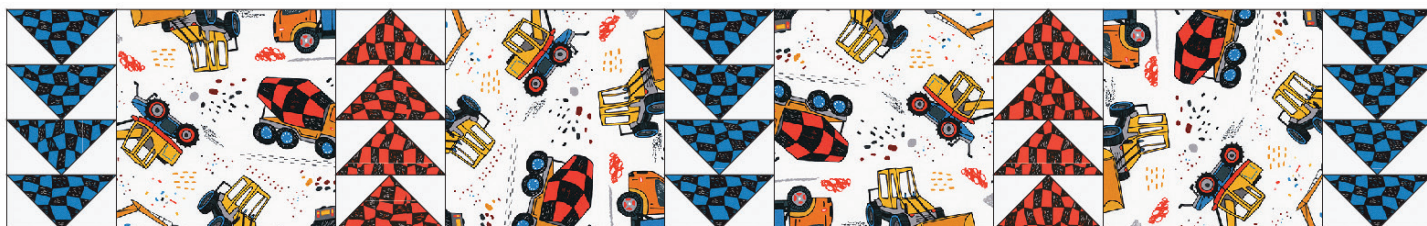
two Fabric K/E Large

## Assemble the Pieced Rows

**Step 6:** Using the diagram as a fabric placement guide, sew thirteen Large Flying Geese together to form Row 1. Press. Repeat to make Row 7.



**Step 7:** Sew three Fabric F units and two Fabric G units from Step 4 together with four Fabric B squares together to form Row 2. Press. Repeat to make Row 6, this time using three Fabric G units and two Fabric F units. Note the directions of the flying geese in each row.



## Assemble the Quilt



**Step 8:** Sew Rows 1-7 together, using Fabric E and Fabric C strips as the sashing. Press.

**Step 9:** Sew the Fabric E top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the Fabric E side inner borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

**Step 10:** Sew the Fabric L side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the Fabric L top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
