Finished quilt measures: 51 " $\times 58$ "

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42 " wide.


## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least $42^{\prime \prime}$ wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!


## From Fabric A, cut:

one 10-1/2" $\times$ WOF strip of each fabric. Subcut:
four $10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles of each fabric.
five 4-1/2" $\times$ WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end, then subcut:
two 4-1/2" $\times 51-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ outer top/bottom borders.
two 4-1/2" $\times 50-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ outer side borders.

## From Fabric $\mathbf{B}$, cut:

one 10-1/2" x WOF strip of each fabric. Subcut:
four $10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles of each fabric.
From Fabric C, cut:
one 10-1/2" x WOF strip of each fabric. Subcut:
four $10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.
Trim one rectangle to $8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

## From Fabric D, cut:

one 10-1/2" x WOF strip of each fabric. Subcut:
four 10-1/2" $\times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.
Trim one rectangle to $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.
Trim one rectangle to $8-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

## From Fabric E , cut:

one 10-1/2" x WOF strip of each fabric. Subcut:
four 10-1/2" $\times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles.
Trim one rectangle to $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$.

## From Fabric F , cut:

three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
Subcut two $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from one strip, then set the remainder of the partial strip and the two full strips aside for the strip piecing.
eleven 1-1/2" x WOF strips. Sew the strips together end-to-end, then subcut:
seven 1-1/2" x 48-1/2" strips-two inner side borders and five sashing strips. two 1-1/2" $\times 43-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ inner top/bottom border strips.

From each of Fabrics G-H, cut:
three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
Subcut two $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles from one strip, then set the remainder of the partial strip and the two full strips aside for the strip piecing.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:
six 2-1/2" x WOF strips.

## Assemble the Blocks

Step 1: Gather the 2-1/2" F-H strips. Select the three partial strips and sew them together lengthwise as shown. Press the seams open or towards the darkest fabric. Cut four 6-1/2" segments from the strip set.


Step 2: Gather one full strip of each fabric. Sew them together lengthwise as shown. Press the seams open or towards the darkest fabric. Make two full strip sets. Cut six 6-1/2" segments from each strip set. You will have a total of sixteen segments. These segments are considered the blocks in the quilt.


Step 3: Gather the $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric G and H rectangles. Sew one of each fabric together lengthwise as shown. Press the seams open or towards the darkest fabric. Make two. These are considered partial blocks.

## Step 4: Arrange

 the 6-1/2" $\times 10-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles, blocks, partial blocks, and 6-1/2" $\times 2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric F rectangles in columns as shown in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.Step 5: Sew blocks, partial blocks, and rectangles together to form the columns. Press the seams open or towards the darkest fabric.

Step 6: Place a $1-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 48-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ sashing strip in between the columns, then sew the sashing and columns together to form the quilt center. Press open or towards the sashing strips.

Step 7: Sew the side inner borders to the
 sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom inner borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Step 8: Sew the side outer borders to the sides of the quilt center. Press toward the borders. Sew the top and bottom outer borders to the quilt center. Press toward the borders.

Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind, and enjoy!
