

## Fabric and Supplies Needed

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42" wide.

## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## **Cutting Instructions**

#### From Fabric A, cut:

one 20" x 50" piece for the front one 24" x 58" piece for the back

Note: For both backing pieces (Fabric A and B), don't worry about cutting to 58" perfectly, use the length that you have which should be at least 58".

### From Fabric B, cut:


one 40" x 50" piece for the front one 58" x WOF piece for the back

Note: For both backing pieces (Fabric A and B), don't worry about cutting to 58" perfectly, use the length that you have which should be at least 58".

## From the binding fabric, cut:

six 2-1/2" x WOF strips

## **Assembly Instructions**



- 1. Sew front panels together with 1/4" seam allowance, pressing seam open. Position the shorter panel on the top or bottom, the order of panels doesn't matter.
- 2. Sew backing panels together along one 58" edge, pressing seam open.
- 3. Baste and quilt as desired. Tip: Any quilting can be used to add another layer of design and interest to this project. Have fun following motifs in the fabric, or create some complementary motifs on your own! Hand quilting or hand tying this type of lawn project will make it super soft and cozy.
- 4. Attach binding strips end to end and attach using favorite binding technique.
