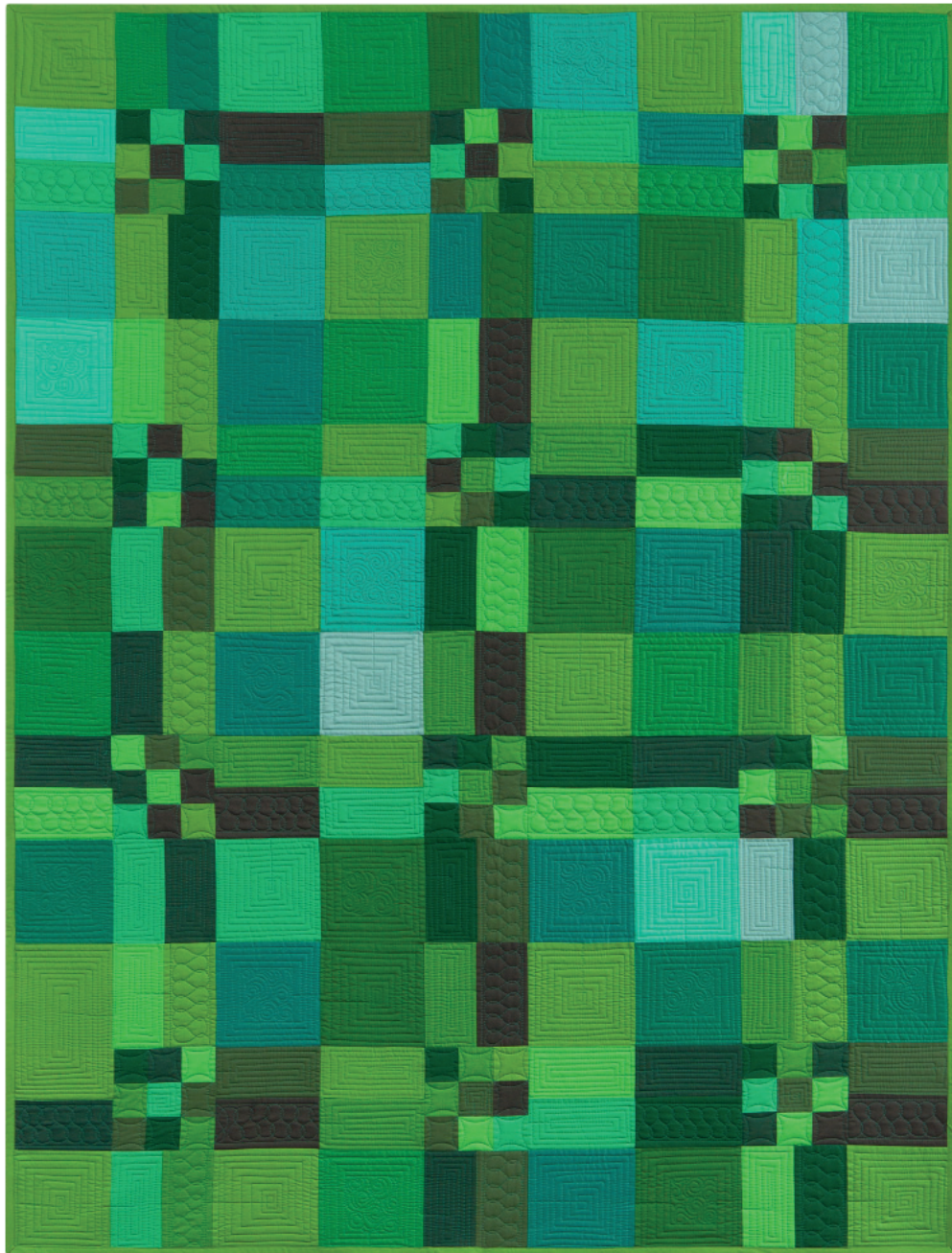

# Fabric and Supplies Needed

*Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 40" wide.*

## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are  $\frac{1}{4}$  unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 40" wide.
- Width of Fat Quarter has been abbreviated to WOFQ.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

## Cutting Instructions

### From each fabric in one FQ bundle, cut:

- one  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 22" (WOFQ) strip
- six squares  $6\frac{1}{2}$ ", for a total of thirty-six

### From the second FQ bundle:

Select four fabrics and from each, cut:

- three  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
- six  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles

From each of the remaining eight fat quarters, cut:

- nine  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles

You should now have:

- ninety-six  $3\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " rectangles
- forty-eight  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " squares
- twelve  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x 22" strips

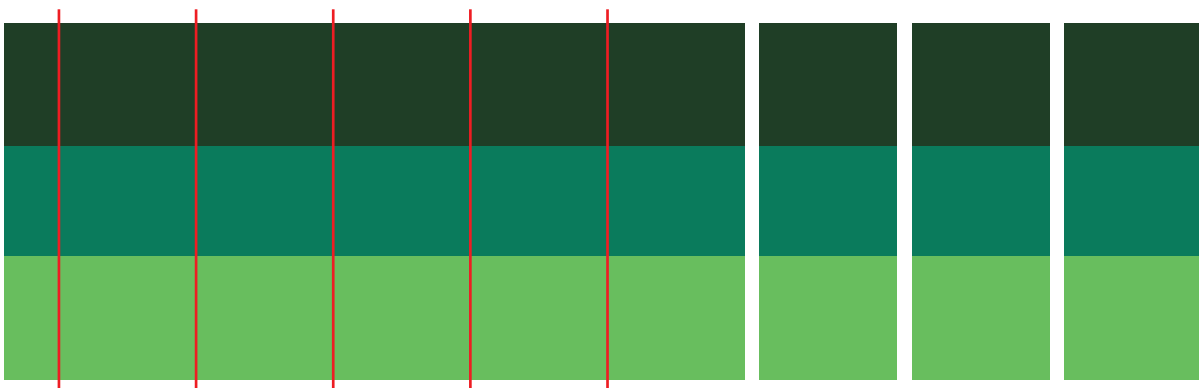
### From the binding fabric, cut:

- seven  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOF strips

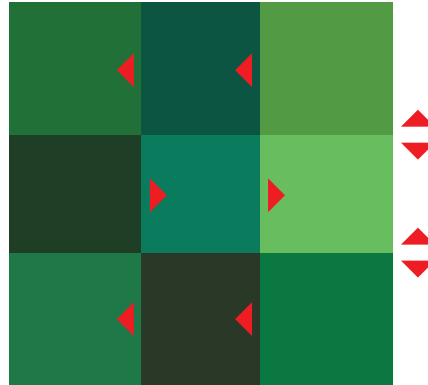
## Assemble the 9-Patch

Sew three  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x WOFQ strips together along the long side, randomly combining the fabrics. Make four strip sets. Press seams to one side.

From these strip sets, cut a total of thirty-six  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " x  $6\frac{1}{2}$ " units.



Sew three different units together to form a 9-patch center block. Alternate directions of the strips so that seams will nest. Press the row seams open. Make twelve 6-1/2" x 6-1/2" blocks.



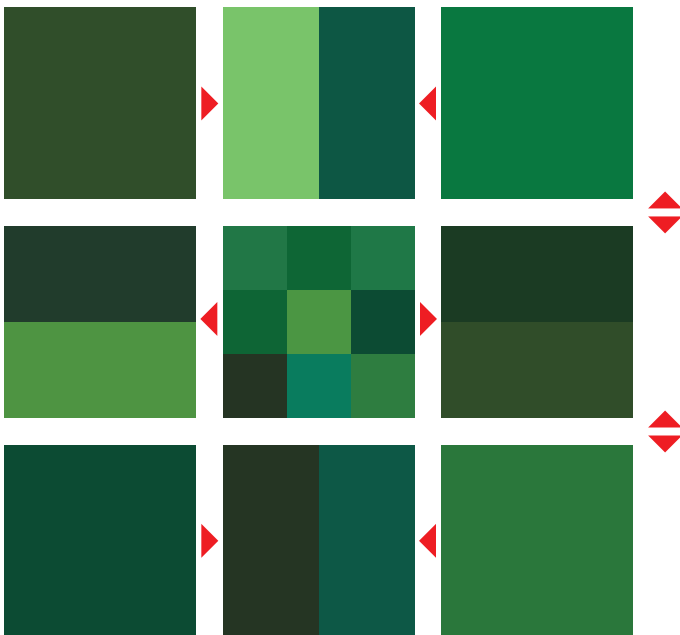
Press seams toward red arrows

### Assemble the Pieced Block



Sew two different 3-1/2" x 6-1/2" rectangles together along the longest side, forming a 6-1/2" square. Press seam to the darker fabric. Make forty-eight.

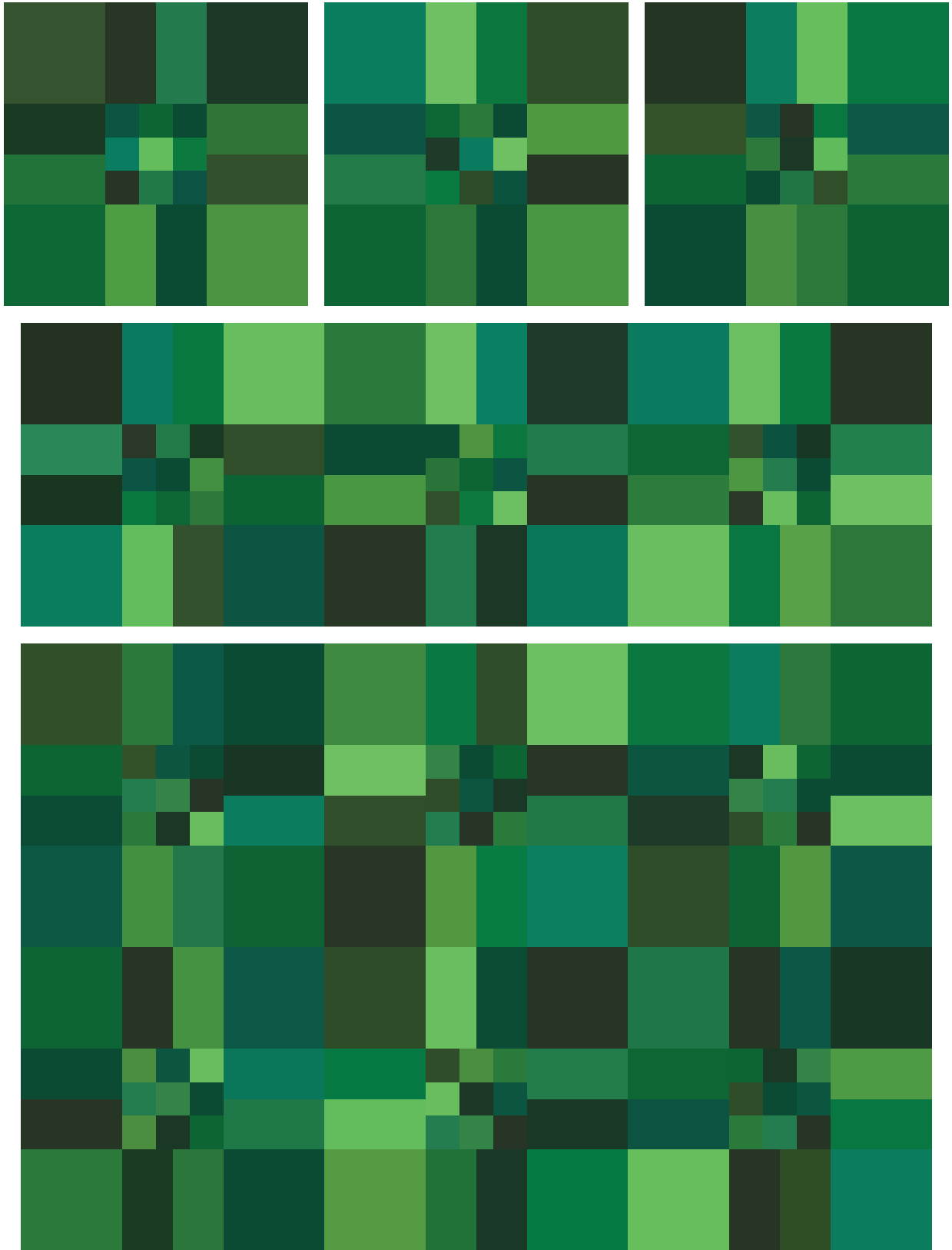
### Assemble the Large Block



Press seams toward red arrows

Gather: four 6-1/2" plain squares, four Pieced Blocks and one 9-Patch unit. Arrange following the Block Assembly Diagram. Sew together in three rows of three, pressing the block seams toward the pieced blocks. Press row seams open. Make twelve 18"x18" Large Blocks.

## Assemble the Quilt



Arrange the Large Blocks in a layout of four rows of three blocks each, rotating and moving the blocks to form a pleasing color arrangement. Sew together, press block seams in alternating directions for every other row so that row seams will nest. Press row seams open.

Your quilt top is now complete. Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!
