Finished quilt measures: $60^{\prime \prime} \times 72^{\prime \prime}$

Fabric amounts based on yardage that is 42 " wide.


## Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are $1 / 4^{\prime \prime}$ unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

## From Fabric A, cut:

four 4-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
thirty $4-1 / 2$ " squares
twenty-three 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one-hundred and twenty $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ rectangles
two-hundred and forty $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ squares
From Fabric B, cut:
twenty-one 2-1/2" x WOF strips. Subcut:
one-hundred and twenty $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2$ " rectangles
one-hundred and twenty $2-1 / 2$ " squares

## From each of Fabrics C-P, cut:

one 4-1/2" x WOF strip. Subcut:
eight or nine 4-1/2" squares from each fabric
Note: a total of one-hundred and twenty 4-1/2" squares are needed.
From the Binding Fabric, cut:
seven 2-1/2" x WOF strips

Step 1: Place a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A square in two opposite corners of a 4-1/2" Fabric C-P square, RST. Note the orientation of the marked diagonal lines. Sew on the marked lines, then trim away the excess fabric, leaving a $1 / 4$ " seam allowance. Press. Repeat on a third corner with a 2-1/2" Fabric B square. Make one-hundred and twenty Snowball units.


Assemble the Rectangle Units
Step 2: Sew a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric A rectangle to one long edge of a $2-1 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 4-1 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ Fabric B rectangle. Press. Make one-hunded and twenty rectangle units.

## Assemble the Blocks



## Step 3: Gather:

one Fabric A square
four Rectangle Units
four Snowball Units made with various fabrics
Arrange the units into three rows of three. Note the fabric placement and block orientation in the Block Assembly Diagram.

Step 4: Sew the squares together to form the rows. Press the seams toward the rectangle units.
Step 5: Sew the rows together, nesting the seams and pressing the seams to one side to form the block.

The resulting Block should measure 12-1/2" square. Make thirty blocks.



Step 6: Arrange the blocks into six rows of five blocks. Note the fabric placement in the Quilt Assembly Diagram.

Step 7: Sew the blocks together to form rows. Press the rows to the left in the odd numbered rows and to the right in the even numbered rows.

Step 8: Sew the rows together to form the quilt center. Press the row seams open.
Your quilt top is complete! Baste, quilt, bind and enjoy!

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
