Notes Before You Begin

- Read through all of the instructions before beginning.
- All of the seam allowances are 1/4" unless otherwise noted.
- Press seam allowances open unless otherwise noted.
- Width of fabric (WOF) is equal to at least 42" wide.
- Right sides together has been abbreviated to RST.
- Remember to measure twice and cut once!

Cutting Instructions

From each 10" Square in your Ten Square Pack, cut:

two 5" xWOF strips. Subcut:

four 5" squares from each square.


A total of one-hundred and forty-nine squares are needed.

From the Binding Fabric, cut:

one 26" x WOF strip. Subcut: one 26" square.

Assemble the Project

Step 1: Arrange the 5" squares in thirteen rows as shown.



Step 2: Baste and quilt the project top as desired.




Step 3: Find and mark the center of the project. Measure from the center point and mark 29-1/4" distances around the outer edge of the project. Connect the points to mark the outer edge of the project.

Step 4: Measure from the center point again and mark 4" distances to form the center opening. If you prefer, you can use the template on page 6 or a bowl or other household object of similar size to mark the circle.


Step 5: Find and mark the center of one side to make a split in the project.

Step 6: Cut on the marked lines to trim the outer edge of the project, the inner opening, and the split.

Step 7: Cut the 26" square once on the diagonal.



Step 8: Sew the two triangles together as shown, then press the seam open. You will have a parallelogram shaped fabric now.



Step 9: Cut 2-1/2" strips parallel to the 45° degree edge of the parallelogram.



Step 10: Sew the strips together end-to-end to create the bias strip.

Step 11: Fold the bias strip in half lengthwise, then press.

Step 12: Match the raw edge of the binding strip to the edge of the project on the top side and sew it in place. Fold the binding to the backside of the project, then machine or hand sew the binding to the backside of the project.
